AGENDA REPORT

#### OBJECTIVE

The objective of this report is to present sufficient information to the Reclamation District 900 (RD 900/District) Board of Trustees (Board) to continue remote (teleconference/videoconference) Board meetings by finding, pursuant to Assembly Bill 361 (AB 361), that the Board has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency related to the COVID-19 Pandemic and that the Yolo County Public Health Officer continues to recommend measures to promote social distancing.

#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Staff respectfully recommends that the Board adopt Resolution 22-04-01 finding that the Board has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency and that the Yolo County Public Health Officer continues to recommend measures to promote social distancing.

#### BACKGROUND

Prior to the outbreak of the COVID-19 Pandemic (pandemic), the Ralph M. Brown Act (Brown Act) had numerous requirements for local government bodies wishing to meet remotely via teleconference or videoconference. These requirements are outlined in greater detail later in the report, but can generally be described as burdensome and, as a result, few bodies regularly met remotely.

In response to the outbreak of the pandemic, on March 4, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a state of emergency related to the pandemic. That proclamation applies statewide and remains valid. On March 17, 2020, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-29-20 (Executive Order), which temporarily suspended certain Brown Act requirements. Namely, the Executive Order suspended requirements that:

- local bodies notice each teleconference location from which a member participates in a public meeting;
- each teleconference location be accessible to the public;
- members of the public be allowed to address the body at each teleconference conference location;
- the local body post agendas at all teleconference locations; and,
- at least a quorum of the members of the local body participate from locations within the boundaries of the territory over which the local body exercises jurisdiction.

Since that time, the Board has been conducting meetings via videoconference under the provisions of the Executive Order. On June 11, 2021—before the delta variant of COVID-19 was widespread in California—the Governor declared that the emergency Brown Act teleconferencing provisions would expire on September 30, 2021.

In light of the surge of COVID-19 spread since that time and recognizing a need for flexibility during future states of emergency, the Legislature passed, and the Governor signed AB 361. This legislation went into effect immediately upon the Governor's signing, September 16, 2021, and amended the Brown Act to add simplified procedures to make it easier to hold remote meetings during a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor so long as certain other requirements are met.

In summary, the benefits of conducting remote meetings pursuant to AB 361 versus the alternative Brown Act procedure are as follows:

## ANALYSIS

AB 361 requires that legislative bodies make the following findings by majority vote within 30 days of each meeting held under the AB 361 exemptions to the Brown Act in order to continue conducting meetings remotely:

- a) The legislative body has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and,
- b) Either: 1) the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or 2) state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

The Board's last meeting was held remotely pursuant to AB 361. The recommendation before the Board is to adopt Resolution 22-04-01 making these findings so that the District's public meetings may continue via teleconference pursuant to AB 361. Staff recommends adopting the resolution at this time so that the Board may continue to meet via teleconference at its May 19, 2022, meeting. The conditions set forth by AB 361 allowing the continuation of meetings under certain exemptions from the Brown Act remain in place as both the Governor's proclamation of state of emergency and the Yolo County Health Officer's recommended measures to support social distancing are in effect.

### <u>Alternatives</u>

The District's primary alternatives are as follows.

- 1. Adopt Resolution 22-04-01, making the findings required by AB 361; or
- 2. Adopt Resolution 22-04-01, making the findings required by AB 361 with directed revisions; or
- 3. Decline to adopt Resolution 22-04-01, thereby not making the findings required by AB 361.

Staff is prepared to implement Alternative 1. Staff would discourage any substantive revisions under Alternative 2, as such revisions may not comply with AB 361. Staff would also discourage Alternative 3 as the Yolo County Health Officer's guidance is to avoid large in person gatherings due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

In light of the ongoing public health emergency related to COVID-19 and the high level of community transmission of the virus that causes COVID-19, the Yolo County Public Health Officer recommends that public bodies continue to meet remotely to the extent possible. Board and Commissions can utilize the provisions of newly-enacted AB 361 to maintain remote meetings under the Ralph M. Brown Act and similar laws.

Among other reasons, the grounds for the remote meeting recommendation include:

- The continued threat of COVID-19 to the community. As of September 22, 2021, the current case rate is 24.1 cases per 100,000 residents per day. This case rate is considered "high" under the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) framework for assessing community COVID-19 transmission; and
- The unique characteristics of public governmental meetings, including the increased mixing associated with bringing together people from across the community, the need to enable those who are immunocompromised or unvaccinated to be able to safely continue to fully participate in public governmental meetings, and the challenges of ensuring compliance with safety requirements and recommendations at such meetings.

Meetings that cannot feasibly be held virtually should be held outdoors when possible, or indoors only in small groups with face coverings, maximal physical distance between participants, use of a portable HEPA filter (unless comparable filtration is provided through facility HVAC systems), and shortened meeting times.

This recommendation is based upon current conditions and available protective measures. The Public Health Officer will continue to evaluate this recommendation on an ongoing basis and will communicate when there is no longer such a recommendation with respect to meetings for public bodies.

### **RESOLUTION 22-04-01**

### A RESOLUTION OF RECLAMATION DISTRICT 900 ADOPTING FINDINGS NECESSARY TO CONTINUE CONDUCTING BOARD MEETINGS VIA TELECONFERENCE PURSUANT TO ASSEMBLY BILL 361

WHEREAS, since March 17, 2020, the Reclamation District 900 Board of Trustees (Board) has been meeting via video conference under certain exemptions from the Brown Act pursuant to Executive Order N-29-20; and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2021, the Governor signed into law Assembly Bill (AB) 361 which created exemptions from some of the Brown Act requirements regarding teleconference or videoconference public meetings during declared states of emergency so long as certain other conditions are met (Government Code Section (54953(e)); and

**WHEREAS,** the Board met for the first time pursuant to AB 361 for its October 2021, regular meeting as allowed by AB 361; and

WHEREAS, the Board adopted resolutions at its regular or special monthly meetings since October 2021 making findings to allow continued meetings by teleconference as allowed by AB 361; and

**WHEREAS**, the law requires legislative bodies to make certain findings pursuant to AB 361 in order to continue meeting via teleconference under the Brown Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 8635 et seq., the Board has the authority during a state of emergency to take all actions necessary to perform its functions in the preservation of law and order, preservation of the furnishing of local services, and protection of life and property, which includes the authority to direct meetings to be held via teleconference pursuant to this Resolution; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governor's proclaimed state of emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic dated March 4, 2020, applies statewide and remains in place; and

**WHEREAS**, the Yolo County Health Officer continues to recommend social distancing measures in the interest of public health.

### NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that:

- 1. A state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor remains in effect related to the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- 2. The Reclamation District 900 Board of Trustees has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and
- 3. Local officials (the Yolo County Health Officer) continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing; and
- 4. The Reclamation District Board of Trustees may continue to meet via teleconference pursuant to Government Code Section (54953(e)).

### **OBJECTIVE**

The objective of this report is to obtain the Reclamation District 900 (District) Board of Trustees (Board) approval to amend the existing Shared Services Agreement with the City of West Sacramento for Interim General Manager services to complete an executive level recruitment and provide transition services for the new District General Manager.

#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Staff respectfully recommends that the Board approve Amendment No. 2 to the Shared Services Agreement with the City of West Sacramento, authorizing an appropriation of \$50,000 and extending the term for six months.

#### BACKGROUND

The General Manager position was vacated in March 2021. The District and City of West Sacramento entered into a Shared Services Agreement (Agreement) on March 26, 2021, for the City to provide an Interim General Manager for the District until a permanent replacement could be brought on board. The first recruitment effort was unsuccessful and the Board approved Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement on August 19, 2021.

ANALYSIS The first recruitment conducted did not produce a viable candidate. After compensation adjustments, a second recruitment was conducted and is the final stages of selection and appointment. If this item is approved, Greg Fabun, Flood General Manager for the City of West Sacramento, will continue to serve as the Interim General Manager for the District for up to an additional six months, or until a permanent General Manager is hired. It is also anticipated that Mr. Fabun will provide transition services for the new General Manager during this time frame.

#### Alternatives

Staff recommends the Board extend the term and increase the capacity of the Agreement so that District management services can continue until a new General Manager is hired. The Board may elect to not extend the Agreement. This alternative is not recommended as it would potentially leave the District without any management support.

#### Coordination and Review

This report was prepared in coordination with District counsel.

#### Budget/Cost Impact

Costs associated with the amendment will be shared in accordance with the budget distribution for personnel – 75% 900 Drainage, 22.5% Levee and 2.5% 537 (900-North) Drainage.

## AMENDMENT NO. 2 to the SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT between Reclamation District No. 900 and The City of West Sacramento For Temporary General Manager Services Dated March 26, 2021

This Amendment No. 2 to the Shared Services Agreement ("Agreement") between Reclamation District No. 900 ("RD 900/District") and the City of West Sacramento ("City"), dated March 26, 2021, is made and entered into effective as of April 21, 2022. Except as expressly amended herein, the March 26, 2021, Agreement is in full force and effect.

### RECITALS

**WHEREAS**, the District and City executed an Agreement on March 26, 2021, for the City to provide temporary General Manager services for District; and

**WHEREAS**, the District and City executed Amendment No.1 to the Agreement on August 19, 2021, for the City to continue to provide temporary General Manager services for District; and

**WHEREAS**, General Manager services have been provided by the City for the past twelve months, inclusive of the date of the Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, during that time an evaluation of the structure for permanent District Management was evaluated and a preferred structure was recommended; and

**WHEREAS**, also during that time two recruitments were conducted to fill the vacant General Manager position on a permanent basis; and

WHEREAS, the District and City desire to amend said Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED** by parties hereto to amend said Agreement as follows:

- I. TERM. The term of the Agreement shall be extended to September 26, 2022.
- II. <u>COMPENSATION</u>:

The compensation is increased by \$50,000 for a total amount of \$150,000.

### **OBJECTIVE**

The objective of this report is to present sufficient information to the Reclamation District 900 (RD 900/District) Board of Trustees (Board) to authorize the District Interim General Manager to renew a general, commercial automobile and public officials/management liability insurance policy that provides coverage for the District's assets, employees and the Board in their capacity as public officials in support of District operations.

### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Staff respectfully recommends that the Board:

- Authorize the Interim General Manager to renew the insurance policy with the California Association of Water 1. Companies Joint Powers Risk and Insurance Management Authority through Interwest Insurance Services, LLC (broker); and
- 2. Approve an appropriation of \$5,790 to cover the increase in cost over the amount adopted in the FY21/22 900 Drainage Budget.

### BACKGROUND

Created in 1911, Reclamation District 900's mission is to operate and maintain both the levees and the internal drainage system that reduce flood risk for properties within its boundaries in the City of West Sacramento. The District is responsible for the operation and maintenance of 9 pump stations, 33 pumps/motors, 6 detention basins, 38 miles of canals and 13 miles of levees. As owner of these facilities as well as the large amount of real associated property, the District is exposed to the typical risks associated with property ownership.

The operation of these flood risk reduction systems entail significant exposures beyond the capacity of typical liability insurance policies and are uninsurable through the pooled risk entities often used by municipalities. Consequently, insuring levee systems and their governing bodies is a specialty with many limitations in coverage. AB 656 (2015) provides for the creation and operation of associations that can provide insurance coverages to special districts and agencies. Currently, the California Association of Mutual Water Companies (CalMutuals) Joint Powers Risk and Insurance Management Authority (JPRIMA) provides insurance coverage to the District.

ANALYSIS The current policy contains three types of insurance: General/Property/Management Liability; Commercial Automobile; and Excess Liability. The general liability policy provides the District protection in the conduct of its typical business activities and for events, incidents or injuries that may occur on District property for which the District could be held liable. The Management/Public Officials Liability policy protects the Board from liability related to actions made in their official capacity and includes coverage for employment practices, employee benefits, duty to defend, inverse condemnation and covers both current, past and future employees/Board members.

The policy is contracted and managed through several entities. CalMutuals is an association of primarily water service agencies. The District is a member of CalMutuals. JPRIMA is the insurance underwriting entity along with Allied World (Allied). Allied is the policy's managing underwriter. Interwest Insurance Services, LLC is the broker.

The total policy renewal cost is \$65,790, an 11% (\$6.039) increase over the previous year. The increase is related to overall insurance industry conditions, specifically payouts related to wildfire and weather events. The Agency has a current budget allocation of \$60,000 for insurance costs. The recommended action includes a budget appropriation request of \$5,970 to cover the difference.

#### Alternatives

The recommendation is to authorize the Interim General Manager to renew the insurance policy. The Board can elect to forego acquiring insurance coverage. This alternative is not recommended. The Board can also direct staff to seek out and solicit additional proposals. Previous solicitations have not been successful due to the underlying risk associated with internal drainage levee systems and the lack of competing insurance products providing similar coverages. This alternative is also not recommended.

#### Coordination and Review

The policy terms and report were prepared by staff in consultation with District counsel.

#### Budget/Cost Impact

Insurance costs are included in the District's annual budget. An additional appropriation of \$5,970 is requested to cover the insurance premiums costs above the budgeted amount. There are sufficient reserves in the District fund to cover the additional expense.

### **OBJECTIVE**

The objective of this report is to present sufficient information to the Reclamation District 900 (RD 900/District) Board of Trustees (Board) to endorse a permit application on behalf of the District, as the responsible Local Maintaining Agency (LMA), submitted to the Central Valley Flood Protection Board (CVFPB) by the City of West Sacramento (City) for the Southport Setback Levee Trailhead Project.

### **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Staff respectfully recommends that the Board endorse the City's permit application, attached hereto as Attachment 1, with the conditions specified in the application and as outlined below.

### BACKGROUND

California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Division 1, Chapter 1, Article 3, provides the framework and procedures for the encroachment permit application process required by the CVFPB, part of which is the requirement that an applicant obtain endorsement of the project/application by the LMA that has jurisdiction over where the project is to take place as part of the application process. In this instance, the City is the applicant, and the project is to take place within the District's jurisdiction.

#### ANALYSIS

The City proposes to construct the Southport Levee Trailhead Project (Project), a new trailhead facility adjacent to the Southport Setback Levee at the eastern end of Linden Road. The proposed project will construct an asphalt parking area, restrooms, bicycle racks, an informational kiosk, signage, shade elements, seating, and other support amenities. The project will also construct an ADA-accessible ramp from the parking lot to the top of levee that will eventually connect to the planned Southport Levee Trail.

Because the Project is located adjacent to and on top of a state plan of flood control facility, an encroachment permit from the Central Valley Flood Protection Board is required as well as a 408 permit from the US Army Corps of Engineers.

District staff has reviewed the plans and specifications, has provided minor comments and recommendations and overall supports the Project. Further, staff has determined that the improvements will not interfere with or hinder District responsibilities for Operation & maintenance nor flood fighting operations. An encroachment permit will be required from the District before the Project can proceed and will cover operation and maintenance responsibilities the applicant/Project owner. Accordingly, staff recommends the Board endorse the application with the following condition: the City complete and obtain an RD 900 Encroachment Permit, in substantially the form attached in Attachment 2.

#### <u>Alternatives</u>

The recommendation is that the Board execute the endorsement of the Permit with the conditions noted. The Board may choose not to provide the endorsement, to delay endorsement, or to request additional conditions. Staff does not recommend delaying or refusing to endorse the Permit as the Project cannot move forward without LMA endorsement and with a District-issued Encroachment Permit, the facilities to be constructed will not hinder District operations.

#### Coordination and Review

This report was prepared in coordination with City staff, City design firm Dokken, and District counsel.

4. The permittee shall fully comply with each and every recommendation and requirement set forth herein as well as in the report from the District's Engineer regarding the encroachment above described.

5. This permit does not grant a right to use or construct works on land owned by others.

6. This permit does not establish any precedent with respect to any other application received by the District.

7. To the fullest extent permitted by law, permittee shall indemnify, hold and save the District harmless of and from any liability which may be incurred through injury to person or damage to property arising out of or connected with the construction or installation of the encroachment above described, and from any such liability arising out of or in connected with the maintenance and operation of such encroachment, except where responsibility for maintenance thereof is accepted by the District in writing.

8. If the encroachment above described constitutes the replacement of an open ditch or canal of the District with a covered pipe or conduit, then the pipe or conduit so installed (shall) (shall not) become the property of the District.

9. The project site shall be restored to the condition that existed prior to commencement of work, accept for such improvements as are approved in this permit.

10. Permittee shall acquire no easement or property right in or to the property or right of way of the District by virtue of this permit and the District does not hereby relinquish any right or title therein.

11. Except as herein otherwise provided, all cost of maintenance, repair and replacement of the encroachment above described shall be borne by permittee. Permittee shall, whenever instructed by the District to do so, repair, replace or relocate such encroachment in the manner prescribed by the District whenever the District shall determine that such repair, replacement or relocation is required in the interest of the District. Any such repair, replacement or relocation ordered by the District that is: (a) not completed by the permittee within thirty (30) days after written notice has been given by the District of such required repair, replacement or relocation; or (b) in the case of repair, replacement, or relocation that cannot be completed within thirty (30) days despite permittee's diligent efforts, is not initiated within thirty (30) days of the written notice and then diligently brought to completion by permittee without unnecessary delay,

12. If the permitted encroachment causes physical damage to the District's facilities, real property, or improvements, or otherwise interferes with the District's ongoing maintenance and operation of its reclamation facilities, the permittee shall, whenever instructed by the District to do so, repair, replace or rectify in the manner prescribed by the District such damage or interference at the permittee's sole expense. Any such repair, replacement or other work ordered by the District that is: (a) not completed by the permittee within thirty (30) days after written notice has been given by the District of such required repair, replacement or other work; or (b) in the case of repair, replacement, or other work that cannot be completed within thirty (30) days despite permittee's diligent efforts, is not initiated within thirty (30) days of written notice and then diligently brought to completion by permittee without unnecessary delay, may be performed by the District, at permittee's expense and permittee shall promptly reimburse the District for such repair, replacement or other work.

13. Permittee shall, promptly on the expiration or other termination of this permit, cause to be removed the encumbrance or encroachment above described and shall return the property of the District to the condition existing prior to the issuance of the permit.

14. The District reserves the right of access to the portion of its easement and right of way above described for such maintenance, repairs or alterations of the District facilities or of the facilities described above as may be required for reclamation purposes. The District shall not be responsible for any damage done to surface improvements of permittee whether herein permitted or otherwise where necessary as part of the ordinary and necessary access to or exercise of its easement and right of way for reclamation purposes and need not replace any paving, concrete or other improvement required to be removed or disturbed in the process of such maintenance, repair or alteration. ## Southport Levee Trailhead Project Description

The City of West Sacramento (City) proposes to construct the Southport Levee Trailhead Project (Project), a new trailhead facility adjacent to the Southport Levee Setback Project in Yolo County, California.

The Southport area in West Sacramento has seen major recent urban development into previously rural and agricultural areas as the City expands it housing inventory. The City's Parks Master Plan and the Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Master Plan, aim to create a network of recreation corridors throughout the City serve as recreation and alternative transportation routes for residents of the City. The proposed Southport Levee Trailhead project will enhance public access to the planned Southport Levee Trail that will be located along the levee crown of the recently completed Southport Setback Levees. The purpose of the project is to create Americans with Disabilities (ADA)-compliant accommodations and other amenities to support trail use and open space opportunities in the area.

The proposed project will include an asphalt parking area with 27 parking stalls (2 ADA accessible) and a plaza that includes restrooms, bicycle racks, an informational kiosk, signage, shade elements, seating, other support amenities, and an ADA-accessible ramp from the parking lot to the planned Southport Levee Trail. The preliminary site work will include the following: a site topographic survey and a geotechnical analysis and report. The geotechnical analysis will require soil samples of varying depths to determine soil type and characteristics within the Project area. This preliminary site work will determine different design concepts for the Project. Currently, there are two design concepts that have been approved by the City.

The Project is located in a vacant parcel that has already been disturbed from historic agricultural practices and recent levee construction activities. All ground disturbing activities will take place within the proposed temporary construction areas depicted in the plans. No road closures are anticipated to occur and access to each residence will be maintained. There will be no right-of-way (ROW) impacts, utility easements, or temporary construction easements (TCEs) required. An encroachment permit from the Central Valley Flood Protection Board will be needed.
